- 1 - Clarify the Issue;
- 2- Define Desired Outcomes;
- 3- Develop Strategies;
- 4- Implement and Monitor

Highlights:

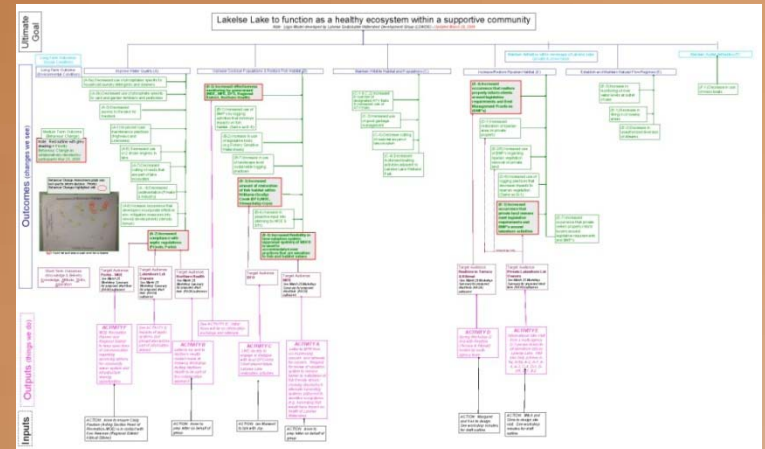
- Collaborative, outcome-based
- Minimal process time (two, day-long workshops), maximum action
- Clear and quick transition from process to actions
- Efficient blend of key components of many tools

‘Why & What’ captured in *logic model* format

- Allows for capture of all things, followed by informed discussion and resultant decision on what to focus and collaborate on first
- Can be updated any time, new participants can enter any time.
- Each agency and partner can see how they can best work with others towards common goals (outcomes)



- 1 year funding for a watershed co-ordinator with Kitimat-Stikine Regional District
- Inter-agency ‘awareness team’ visit to Lakeshore residences
- 2-hr realtor workshop for water-front property issues
- On-going collaboration between agencies and volunteer groups
- Formation of Lakelse Sustainable Watershed Development Group;
- Annual update session planned
